- Care management and transition of care, reaching out to patients who are behind in preventative care





Existing Efforts:

- Work with Medicaid providers and assist people applying for insurance and employment. Address through enhancing health insurance coverage and helping patients navigate healthcare plans
- Utilization of Community Health Workers to connect individuals with resources
- Connect individuals with employer resources and family assistance resources through three school districts. Allow individuals to become successful in school. Partner with local schools, colleges, companies, and mental health to share services
- Aid individuals accessing food, housing, utility assistance
- Participating in county-wide housing study and community development coalition
- Work towards reducing stigma, poverty, discrimination, and marginalized populations
- Provide local grant incentives and conduct economic studies that improve education, infrastructure, regional collaboration, industry activities, and destination marketing



- Community education and awareness, school education



Existing Efforts:

- College and Career Readiness, Post Secondary Degree/Certification attainment, FAFSA
- · Assisting citizens returning to the workforce, aiding in obtaining essential documents such as SS card. Driver's license, and birth certificate
- Homelessness Prevention and Intervention for ages 17 to 24
- Child welfare; abuse and neglect. Working with families to reduce their risk of re-occurring neglect, licensing foster homes
- Outreach to youth ages 12 to 23 who are runaways, homeless, or at-risk
- · Public library; internet and printing
- Substance Abuse Prevention and K-12 Homelessness
- Translation of documents, Interpreting, Education referrals
