HOUSING AS PROFIT

- Short term rentals
- Communities prioritize high income housing and professional income housing, ignore low income
- Primary house purchase as a way to create long-term wealth conflicts with wanting more housing in community. Scarcity is better.
- Market preference for higher end housing
- Cost of development

HOUSING OPTIONS & SUPPLY

- Interpretations of 'safe' cannot always leave current housing if unsafe
- Construction Costs/Contractor Availability for building affordable housing
- Dearth of accessible housing stock still building new homes with staired entry
- Housing available distant from work site
- Rent is high even in counties surrounding central employment zones
- Lack of understanding of what low-income means
- Low income jobs not livable wage
