## 2022 Behavioral Health Internship Survey Findings





## **Summary of Survey Findings**

- 29 organizations that provide behavioral health services completed the survey
- 81% of respondents reported they their organization accepts interns
- 52% of respondents indicated that they have the capacity to accept more interns than what they currently have
- 66% of respondents indicated that they would like to increase their capacity for the number of interns they can currently accept

















- My organization does not currently employ staff members who are qualified to supervise interns.
