NW MICHIGAN'S INTERNSHIP DIRECTORY

The Northwest Michigan Community Health Innovation Region's (CHIR) Behavioral Health Initiative (BHI) is made up of 13 cross-sector Action Teams that work to increase access to behavioral health services and enhance well-being across the region. The Recruit Behavioral Health Interns Action Team developed behavioralhealthinterns.org, an online directory that connects students with internship opportunities across northwest Michigan.

Schools and students can use the site to

learn more about the field placement and internship opportunities that exist, and find contact information for organizations that offer those opportunities.

NORTHWEST EDUCATION SERVICES

Northwest Education Services offers internships for students who are completing their Master of Social Work or School Psychology programs.

Northwest Ed. provides services to students throughout a five county region, including Grand Traverse, Leelanau, Antrim, Benzie and Kalkaska Counties.

Interns with Northwest Education Services will have the opportunity to work under highly skilled professionals, complete evaluations, work with school staff, families, and students to enhance their school experience.

MSW Program Highlight

NORTHERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY

Northern Michigan University (NMU) offers a Global Campus online MSW program that concentrates on the fundamentals of social work, such as human rights and social justice.

Students who enroll in the Global Campus program receive a comprehensive education and are given the opportunity to choose between Clinical or Advanced Generalist areas of study. The program has learning opportunities for both advanced and regular standing students, and students complete their coursework through hands-on experiences and field placement courses.

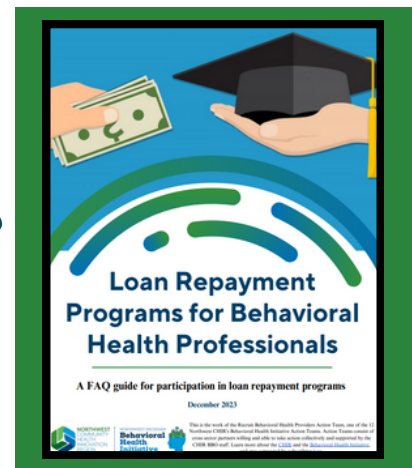
Students enrolled in the Global Campus program will be guided through the field placement process by NMU's Field Coordinator. Students will be able to identify organizations within a preferred area and contact agencies of interest to determine their capacity and ability to provide supervision during the field placement. Students are required to complete a minimum of 900 hours within their field placement, or 500 hours for advanced students.
