

An Update on behavioralhealthinterns.org NW MICHIGAN'S INTERNSHIP DIRECTORY

The Northwest Michigan Community Health Innovation Region's (CHIR) Behavioral Health Initiative (BHI) is made up of 12 cross-sector Action Teams that work to increase access to behavioral health services and enhance well-being across the region. The Recruit Behavioral Health Interns Action Team developed a website that serves as a searchable electronic directory for behavioral health-related internship opportunities in northwest Michigan. During the site's launch party it was suggested that a page be added for organizations to use when they are looking to connect with a school that requires its students to complete internships.

To fulfill that request, a page has been added to the site that lists contact information for field placement faculty at several different universities. NW Michigan Internship Program Highlight NORTH COUNTRY COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH

North Country CMH works with student interns working to obtain their Bachelor or Master of Social Work degree and those studying to become a Licensed Professional Counselor. North Country assists interns with the completion of their educational requirements in the discipline of Behavioral Health. They offer interns a program that includes a variety of opportunities with their wide spectrum of services within the behavioral health field and every internship is individualized based upon the interests of the student. Many interns are offered full time positions at the end of their internship, upon completion of their degrees. Interns are accepted year-round. MSW Program Highlight

FSU's social work program requires students that are studying for either their Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) or Master of Social Work (MSW) degree to complete an internship. BSW students are required to participate in two internship experiences; one at the start of their program and another during their senior year. These internships allow students to gain firsthand social work experience and master the fundamentals of the field. MSW students have different internship requirements, depending on if the student is accepted as a foundation year student (students without a BSW in social work) or enters the program with advanced standing (students with a BSW and a required minimum, overall GPA of 3.2, and a 3.5 average GPA in social work courses).
